

## ESTATE SALE OF THE RENOWNED TOYMAKER

- A **baby-faced bride doll**. The hand-painted porcelain features are of exquisite quality, despite a missing eye: a strangely life-like blush to the cheek, tiny fingers peeking from beneath lace sleeves. From the empty socket sprout a cluster of tiny, bell-shaped ruby-colored spores. More caps and stalks bloom through the holes of her ivory gown.
- A **vintage red and gold race car** shaped like a beetle. The tin and aluminum plating is painted in a jaunty, if faded, scale pattern. A driver figurine is visible through the bubble of a windshield, bulging out in two bulbous eye protrusions. It lacks any visible doors.
- A **to-scale model of a Viking ship** in a **rune-carved wooden box**. The prow boasts a three-faced head: a weeping man, a snarling wolf, and a horned bull, all joined on a single neck. Ignore what appears to be the minor cosmetic damage— scratches, claw marks, torn sails— it's part of the historical accuracy! (Warning: Do not store near flowing water.)
- A **top-hat wearing rat** with a **gold-tipped cane**. It is plump, well-stuffed, and posed as if standing rakishly on two hind paws. Half of the tail is missing. The black fur, though short, is surprisingly soft, and speckled here and there with patches of white and ash gray. The rat's expression appears to be smug.
- A **metal figurine** of something that **appears to be a horse**. Although the coating on the body is gone, the sets of resin eyes remain a deep black. Two additional semi-skeletal arms grow from the back haunches. The mane is long, soft, and somewhat sticky. In a cheery display of showmanship, the horse's maw is thrown open in an endless scream.
- An **old-fashioned costume of a surgeon's uniform**. Most of the pieces are missing, save for a rusty saw. It is three feet long, and despite the state of the blade, sharp, with a well-oiled wooden handle and a leather sheath to attach to a belt. The label on the costume bag declares "Size: Extra Large."

- A **rainbow hula-hoop**. It makes a lovely soft rattling noise when moved. Visible in the center of the hoop is a shifting, floating bubble of color with jagged edges, like a mid-air oil slick or a poorly stitched up tear on a pair of jeans. It is difficult to look at for long periods of time.
- A **boxed-up cooking set** and **cast-iron miniature cauldron**. The faded packaging appears to depict a woman dressed in layers of gauzy fabric. Her eyes are glowing. The text on the box reads “Hag’s First Cookware Set: Prophetic! Diegetic! Not for Diabetics!”
- A **wind-up toy hydra**. The body is beautifully detailed in greens and blues, with purple feathering on the necks and the joints of the limbs. It is covered in a thin layer of gray ash. All of the heads but two are broken off.
- A **posable action figure** of **The First Fool**. Inside the plastic packaging there is a thin, but handsome, man dressed in black motley. His morose face is decorated with skull makeup. The toy includes a fascinating variety of additional items to pose the Fool with: a noose, a hangman’s axe, a wooden stake, a fiery torch, a trumpet, and a cap decorated with bells.
- A **record player** and **two vintage vinyl albums**. A bold, brass speaker sits on top of this three-legged classic piece of furniture. The first disc is titled “Your Favorite Song” and the second is titled “Howling and Yowling: Neighborhood Hits.” There is no volume control, and neither album plays out loud when set on the record player.
- A set of **wooden rings** and **stacking pole**. They are slightly oily when handled. The spikes, nails, and needles are all the same color, but each ring is slightly larger than the next. They are impossible to stack. Perfect for children!
- A **crystal ball, stand, and display case**. The sphere is approximately 5 inches in diameter and cold to the touch. Gold swirls and red velvet lining decorate the inside of the angular glass case. The ball sits on a metal stand of three inward-facing legs, styled to look like bony claws. The crystal is foggy and impenetrable– depending on how long you look.

If item comes with additional passenger (a strange shadow at your window, laughter whenever you turn away, duplicates of item appearing in unusual places) inform the transaction manager so they can mark up your payment interest to account for additional value.
